

National Road Haulage Certificate in Professional Competency (CPC)

Aims and Objectives:

The Traffic Commissioners require professional competence to be demonstrated by at least one member of the management team. This applies to all businesses which hold a standard operator's licence and which operate vehicles with a gross plated weight of more than 3.5 tonnes or, vehicles which are not plated and which have an unladen weight of more than 1525 kg. The professionally competent person will often be employed as the Transport Manager. The objective is to enable the holder to apply for a Standard National Operators Licence, proving that they are professionally competent, which enables an operator to carry goods for hire or reward in the UK.

Learning Outcomes:

- Understanding the Legal and Business Context for Road Transport Operations
- Understanding National Road Haulage Transport Operations
- Managing National Road Haulage Transport Operations

Examinations take place four times a year in March, June, September and December. To achieve the National Certificate of Professional Competence the above three modules must be achieved.

Target Group:

Those who wish to enter the profession of Road Haulage Transport Management or demonstrate their professional competence to meet the Operator Licensing requirements.

Duration:

Delivered as a night class two nights per week, consisting of 2½ hours per night over a 16 week period, leading up to the national exam date.
